Like many other schools, Faith Academy Bellville (FAB) is in the home stretch at the end of the school year. But for our Registrar, Tami Klecka, this is her prime time, her Super Bowl, and her March Madness, because it's our enrollment season.

She's busy helping both current students and new and prospective ones through the enrollment process, which involves forms, records, interviews, assessments, and also taking prospective students and their families on tours of the school. In a given week, she may be showing four families around campus.

"I love meeting the new families. Last year, I was so excited by the new families that enrolled. We're seeing many new faces, with some driving as far as Fulshear to come to school. Faith Academy is growing with some classes already full for next year," Tami said.

Preparing High School Students for College

In addition to welcoming new students to the FAB family, Tami supports our high school students, ensuring they are ready for college, trade school, or whatever path God lays out for them after high school.

Each fall and spring semester, Tami sits down with students at every grade level, freshman through senior, guided by a well-thought-out binder of topics and resources she has built over time. For 9th graders, that means a High School 101 talk covering everything from how many credits they need to graduate to what a credit even is. She gets them off on the right foot by explaining how their GPA is earned and calculated, so they can start thinking about college or their next steps after graduation.

Sophomore year may not have the fanfare of freshman orientation or the urgency of junior year, but it's far from quiet. Our Dean of Academics, Terri Tomlinson, and her assistant, Susan Crawford, guide 10th-grade students through the PSAT and NMSQT, the qualifying test for National Merit Scholarships. Meanwhile, Tami is busy behind the scenes, reviewing transcripts, auditing credits, and mapping each student's path to graduation so no one falls behind before they even realize they're at risk.

In junior year, Tami works with students on writing a resume, which they are tasked with completing over the summer. She also encourages them to use their two available days for college visits to begin the process of determining what they want to do after graduation. Junior year is also when the high-stakes testing ramps up. Juniors and seniors are prepping for and taking the SAT and ACT. Last year, FAB also offered the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB), which the U.S. military uses to assess prospective members — and which Tami says is also a great way for any student to identify skills and strengths suited for various professions.

Throughout their senior year, Tami spends a lot of time helping students prepare for the next chapter. She works diligently to ensure they are on track to complete their required coursework, which is the same as the State of Texas requires for public school students. She's also reminding them to visit colleges and helping them track their GPAs and class rank. Knowing that there's a lot of activity during senior year, she also keeps parents informed and supports them as needed.

When it comes to funding that next chapter, Tami has that covered, too. Sitting next to her college prep binder is Tami's scholarship binder, filled to the brim with local and national scholarship opportunities. She updates the deadlines, eligibility, requirements, and other pertinent information in the binder and on the FAB website every couple of weeks, sharing it with students and parents.

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Dual-Credit and Advanced Placement Offer College Credit to FAB High School Students

FAB high school students have many of the same academic opportunities as public school students, with more planned every year. We offer dual-credit classes in Government and English to juniors and seniors in partnership with Blinn College. Our own Ms. Brittany Guardia teaches the U.S. History dual-credit class in person at the FAB campus, which is a beneficial way for students to adjust to college-level courses. FAB also offers Advanced Placement (AP) English, taught by FAB teacher Ms. Haleigh Littleton, to juniors and seniors, who can earn college credit.

“One of our graduating seniors has enough college credit to enter college next year as a sophomore. Before her junior year, she printed off the core requirements for the college she wanted to attend and started checking off the college courses she could attend during her junior and senior years,” Tami said.

The FAB team works with the 9th- and 10th-grade teachers to assess who is ready and likely to succeed in these college-level courses. Tami also hosts an informational meeting for parents and students each January as families prayerfully consider whether dual credit or AP classes are the right path for their students.

“We want to set our students up for success, so assessing who is capable of both the academic requirements and personal responsibility expected at the college level is important to us,” Tami said.

The FAB team also listens to students' needs and works hard to accommodate them. For instance, several students plan to enter nursing and would like to take a statistics dual-credit class required for their future degree. Tami said FAB does offer calculus as an advanced class, which has been beneficial to students.

“It’s a catch-22 because we need a certain number of students to be able to offer classes, but sometimes the lack of those classes prevents students from enrolling at FAB. Terri (Tomlinson) and Susan (Crawford) do all that they can, including enrolling 11th and 12th graders into a class together when possible to meet the required numbers,” Tami said.

Partnering with Bellville ISD’s College and Career Counselor also ensures our high school students have every opportunity we can provide to succeed after graduation. Our families and students have benefited from their financial aid informational classes and college and career fairs.

“It’s helpful to collaborate with Bellville ISD. For instance, if a recruiter comes to Bellville from Texas A&M, I coordinate with Bellville so the recruiter can visit both schools in one trip,” Tami explained.

From serving as the first face many prospective families see, to supporting our graduating seniors as they embark on a new chapter in their lives, Tami touches everyone at FAB. Her role involves so much more than is visible day-to-day, and she does it with love and a passion for the families, students, and staff.

SAN FELIPE de AUSTIN

— STATE HISTORIC SITE —
San Felipe, Texas

From Ms. Brittany Guardia.....

The 5th-grade class recently had the wonderful opportunity to visit San Felipe de Austin, the colonial capital of Texas, and they wanted to share their thoughts with everyone about what they learned while visiting this incredible Texas Historical Commission site.

From the 5th-grade class:

We all had an incredible time visiting San Felipe de Austin, the colonial capital of Texas. Some of our favorite things that we learned included information about Stephen F. Austin's first immigrant colony in Coahuila y Tejas (one of the newly established Mexican colonies under the Mexican Constitution of 1824), the saga of the Runaway Scrape of 1836, and what life was like for the Texian pioneers living in Colonial Texas. We would like to share our favorite facts with you! Aria Villarreal wanted you all to know that "I learned that Stephen F. Austin's middle name is Fuller! We should use it more often!"

Cambry Courville and Miranda Lapham stated, "'The Runaway Scrape' was my favorite thing to learn about! I learned that the people had to burn their own town to the ground so that General Santa Anna and his army could not use anything. Sam Houston ordered the town to be burned." All of our students enjoyed learning about the Runaway Scrape in the beautiful San Felipe de Austin Pioneer Museum, but thought that it was also very sad how they had to watch their homes be destroyed by the flames.

Emily Feiertag and Grady Ward said, "my favorite part was learning about the 'Texas Toothache Tree,' and how the citizens of San Felipe de Austin chewed on the leaves and bark of the tree when they had any mouth pain or toothaches. We also learned that the town did not have a dentist, so the local blacksmith had to yank their teeth out with a hook!" The students participated in a "naturalist scavenger hunt," locating many useful elements in nature and Gibson Schroller said this was his favorite part! Tori Davies said "it was so interesting to see how many useful things we could find on our scavenger hunt!" The students were also shown how the leaves of the Yaupon Holly tree can be dried, roasted, and used to make a caffeinated tea. Colette Hyslop, Giselle Schulte, and Ellie Kate Cameron all loved learning about the Yaupon Holly and how the colonial residents used to call it their "colonial coffee."

The students also had the opportunity to learn to bake molasses cornbread in Miss Celia's (a former slave who sued for her own freedom) kitchen with the help of our history guide, Miss Nicole. Celia's case was held in San Felipe, and William Barrett Travis was her lawyer! Zachary Sharma and Knox Reynolds loved the baking station and said, "We learned how to 'decipher' colonial recipes and translate them into modern recipes! It was fun learning to bake in the colonial kitchen!" Mayson Araoz said, "I loved learning to make the old-fashioned cornbread that the colonists called 'Indian Cakes.' They were delicious!"

While visiting the print shop, we observed how newspapers and legal documents were printed in the early 1800s. We used the printing press to create replicas of William B. Travis's letter from the Alamo, declaring "Victory, or Death!" Shiloh Horsely wanted everyone to know that "we learned their printing press worked so well and so quickly, that the townspeople thought it was by magic!"

Ila Hargrave loved learning that our use of “upper case” and “lower case” came from how the larger and smaller print type letters were stored in “upper” or “lower” cases, with the larger letters in cases above the smaller ones. We also learned that the original papers used for legal documents were made from cloth towels imported from Germany!

The students learned that because of a lowercase “k” print type letter found near the remains of a brick chimney, the archaeologists knew where to rebuild the print shop! Getting to use the printing machine and being Mr. Mark’s “printing apprentice” was Corbin Stodder, Wyatt Waxler, and Dash Garza’s favorite part!

We all learned a lot about the colonial history of Texas and the importance of San Felipe de Austin to our freedom and independence from Mexico. Long before Washington on the Brazos became the hub of Texas independence, San Felipe was already on the “road to the revolution!”

The 5th-grade class wants everyone to know they should make time to go out and visit San Felipe de Austin.


