Iowa Assessments Testing

The lowa Test is an achievement test used to assess student learning in reading, language, math, science, and social studies.

Kindergarten through 8th grade students will test Tuesday through Thursday, **April 29, 30, and May 1,** from approx. **8:00 to 11:00 AM.**

Friday, May 2, will be used as a make-up test day.

Please refrain from making any morning appointment for your child on these days.

Classroom observations on testing days for students K-8th should only be planned after lunch.

A small snack will be provided each day. Students should bring a water bottle daily.

Lunch will be served as usual.

Test Taking Tips for Students (& Parents)

Get a good night's sleep. Being rested helps you think more clearly.

Eat a healthy breakfast to sustain your energy. Avoid sugary goods that can give you're a rush of energy but will wear off quickly, leaving you feeling tired.

Remember that God has a purpose and is with your always providing never-ending love and grace.





Dear Faith Family,

As we round the corner and head for home this school year, it gets busy and the "process" of school might be becoming laborious. Life can prove difficult; family, blended family, extended family, work, health or financial struggles-or both. Does it ever feel like your life will not settle down? If you have a minute, read Psalm 13:1-6 and use the suggestions David gives when finding himself in times of crisis.

Keep Going Psalm 13:1-6 Nicky Gumbel

David's example suggests four things that you should continue to do during difficult times:

Keep praying

David continues to cry out to God, 'Look on me and answer, O Lord my God. Give light to my eyes' (v.3). He *pours out his heart* to God. Don't give up praying even when God seems far away.

Keep trusting

'But I *trust* in your unfailing love' (v.5a). 'I've thrown myself headlong into your arms' (v.5a, MSG). It is relatively easy to have faith when things are going well, but the test of faith is when things do not appear to be going well.

Keep rejoicing

He does not rejoice in the trials, but in God's salvation. He says, 'my heart *rejoices* in *your salvation*' (v.5b). 'I'm celebrating your rescue' (v.5b, MSG).

Keep worshipping

In spite of everything he has been through, David is able to see the goodness of God: 'I will *sing* to the Lord, for he has been good to me' (v.6). He remembers all that God has done for him.

As you begin to praise and worship God, it brings perspective to your problems. Sometimes, I find it helpful to look back on my life and thank the Lord for bringing me through so many of my own personal struggles, disappointments and bereavements, and to remember how, through it all, 'he has been good to me' (v.6).

Lord, I worship you today. Thank you for your goodness to me. For all the battles ahead, I trust in your unfailing love.

From Ms. Guardia:

The 5th grade class recently had the wonderful opportunity to visit San Felipe de Austin, the first colonial capital of Texas, and they wanted to share their thoughts with everyone about what they learned while visiting this incredible Texas Historical Commission site.

From the 5th grade class:

We all had an incredible time visiting San Felipe de Austin, the first colonial capital of Texas. Some of our favorite things that we learned included information about Stephen F. Austin's first immigrant colony in Coahuila y Tejas (one of the newly established Mexican colonies under the Mexican Constitution of 1824), the saga of the Runaway Scape of 1836, and what life was like for the Texian pioneers living in Colonial Texas. We would like to share our favorite facts with you!

Kaitlyn McCready states "The Runaway Scrape' was my favorite thing to learn about! I learned that the people had to burn their own town to the ground so that General Santa Anna and his army could not use anything. Sam Houston ordered the town to be burned." Vivian Winch and Avery Sovereign also enjoyed learning about the Runaway Scrape, but thought that it was also very sad how they had to watch their homes be destroyed by the flames.

Allysa Castillo said "my favorite part was learning about the 'Texas Toothache Tree', and how the citizens of San Felipe de Austin chewed on the leaves and bark of the tree when they had any mouth pain or toothaches. I also learned that the town did not have a dentist, so the local blacksmith had to yank their teeth out with a hook!"

The students also had the opportunity to learn and to bake molasses cornbread in Miss Celia's (a former slave who sued for her own freedom) kitchen. Celia's case was held in San Felipe, and William Barrett Travis was her lawyer! Charlee Mayfield and Shelby Poulter both noted how impressed by Celia they were, and that it was fun learning to bake in her kitchen.

Zeke Dorado and Alan Bartley enjoyed visiting the replica of the pioneer school, and learning how the older students (called the "monitors) helped to teach the younger students subjects like spelling and reading. While visiting the print shop, we got to see how newspapers and legal documents were printed in the early 1800s. We saw replicas of William B. Travis's letter from the Alamo, declaring "Victory, or Death!" Avery Fullen loved learning that our use of "upper case" and "lower case" came from how the larger and smaller print type letters were stored in "upper" or "lower" cases, with the larger letters in cases above the smaller ones.

We all learned a lot about the colonial history of Texas, and the importance of San Felipe de Austin to our freedom and independence from Mexico. Long before Washington on the Brazos became the hub of Texas independence, San Felipe was already on the "road to the revolution!"

The 5^{th} grade class wants everyone to know they should make time to go out and visit San Felipe de Austin.


